The petition of JOSEPH LUCKOW, hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 1302 AVE. A 1302 AVE. A (give number and street) New York City, N. Y.

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiances and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to REP OF AUSTRIA & (OR) REP OF POLAND of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 15 day of Aug anno Domini 1913, and in the State of New York, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ anno Domini 1913, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court.
